Locate

Isolate

Evacuate

Emergency Mobilization

Resolve

Deactivate

Locate:

- Assess the emergency/threat/danger
  - o Determine the type of emergency/threat
  - o Determine needs
    - Staff
    - Safety equipment (PPE)
    - Need for evacuation

Isolate:

- Contain threat/danger
- Reinforce perimeter
- Secure unaffected areas

## Emergency Response Plan Training Nov. 2021

- Establish response group
  - SPEED – helps to stop spread

### Evacuate:

- Determine if it is a life/death emergency
  - Do you need evac. chains?
  - Determine need for partial or full evacuation
- Notify Chain of Command
  - Supervisor
  - Sergeant
  - Control
  - Netcom
  - Patrol
  - Lieutenant
  - Chief
- Move inmates to unaffected area of jail
  - Other facilities
    - Classification Plan
- Mutual Aid

### Emergency Mobilization:

- Fire
- AMR
- CERT
- Swat
- Bomb Team
- Medical
- Mutual Aid

### Resolve:

- Reduce threat/danger
  - Extinguish fire
  - Ventilation
  - Restore order

### Deactivate:

- Debrief
- Document
- Preserve Evidence (if applicable)

## **Types of Emergencies**

### Fire:

- Move inmates to safety/nearest clean-air environment
- Check for injuries
- Contain/isolate danger
- Extinguish fire/ventilation

### Earthquake:

- Account for inmates/injuries
- Inspect facility for damage/threats
- Move inmates if needed

### Flood:

- Account for inmates/injuries
- Move inmate to unaffected area/other facilities

### Power/Communication Loss:

- Utilize emergency radio channels
  - Orange/Red
    - Orange is primary for Jail, does not reach from far end of west to booking, will need to stage people between the two points

### Riot:

- Isolate
- Assess for injuries/death
  - Parties involved
  - Hostages?
    - No Hostage Policy (400.8)
  - Remember, time is on our side

### Bomb Threat:

- See Flyer
  - Will post at all workstations with public phone access
    - Reception, CAP, Control, Booking

Domestic Terrorism Threat:

- Bomb
- Communication
- Water supply
- Inmate food
- Mail
- In-person (Lobby)

Terrorism Liaison Officer:

- CO J. Reed
  - Report to Northern California Regional Intelligence Center (NCRIC)
- Anyone can report by going to website
- NCRIC MOTO - SEE SOMETHING SAY SOMETHING
  - Information goes out to other agencies

<b><u>Course Title:</u></b>	Officer Safety
<b><u>Course Goal:</u></b>	This course is designed to refresh staff on the importance of Officer Safety within the Jail. This course will go over assault risk inmates, transport risk inmates, and escape risk inmates as well as current policies regarding the types of restraints used while transporting these high-risk inmates outside of the facility, including to court. We will go over how to distinguish between a high-risk inmate and general population inmates.

**Course Objectives**

Upon completion of the instruction, staff will have basic understanding regarding:

1. The difference between an assault risk inmate, transport risk inmate, and escape risk inmate
  - a. When they wear identifying clothing ie: to court, transportation, in the unit
2. Staff will recognize the similarities between assault risk inmates, transport risk inmates, and escape risk inmates
  - a. All three wear striped clothing, all three require two officers present
3. Staff will be able to distinguish between high-risk inmates and general population inmates
  - a. Striped clothing opposed to solid based clothing
